Safe Citizen Program and Autism Awareness

Several years ago the City of Plymouth Police Department began offering a program to our physical, mental and neurological impaired citizens called Safe Citizen. It is designed for those who may walk away from their homes and be unable to communicate their name or address to authorities.

A file is maintained in the Police Department containing a photo and contact information for these citizens. In the event they become disoriented or lost, we will have the information available to identify the person. We will then contact the responsible person listed on their form and return them safely to their homes.

As first responders we recognized the need to move beyond simply reacting to a call and with assistance of Jack's Place for Autism have added strength to our Safe Citizen Program.

Beginning October 1st, 2015 the City of Plymouth Police will offer the following items for pick-up, free of charge, at our front desk located inside Plymouth City Hall, 201 S. Main St in downtown Plymouth.

At the time of pick up we would request that a Safe Citizen form be completed, which can also be found on our website at <https://cityplymouth.seamlessdocs.com/f/KjlkWm> The completion of the form is not required but will assist police and fire first responders in properly assisting those in need.
