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Ross Street - Water Main and Street Improvement Project

General Description of the Work:

Contractors for the City of Plymouth will be completing a water main and street reconstruction project in the southwest section of the City on Ross Street (Between Evergreen and McKinley). The anticipated start date is June 17, 2019. You may see signs and equipment on-site before this date.

Improvement Project Details:

Anticipated Start Date: June 17, 2019
Anticipated Duration: Through August 2019 (open before Labor Day)
Location: Ross Street from Evergreen Street to McKinley Street;

Water Main:

- New 8-inch water main, valves and hydrants
- New connections and water services up to right-of-way line

At various times, the public water service will be shut-off in order to make connections to the system. Notice will be given to residents in advance of water service interruption. Notices will be delivered to your front door. All new water main will undergo bacteriological and pressure testing prior to being placed in service.

Road Reconstruction:

- Complete road reconstruction (new curb and gutter, new aggregate base and new asphalt)
- New concrete drive approaches up to right-of-way line
- Miscellaneous sidewalk repairs and ADA improvements at the intersections.

Please use caution when walking, jogging, biking or driving in the construction area.

The following information is provided as a tentative contractor schedule. Contractor schedules are often subject to change due to weather, field conditions, and material availability.

Anticipated Sequence of Construction

1. Mobilization and Traffic Control set up	Week of June 17th
2. Pavement Removal	June 18 th through 24 th
3. Water System Improvements	June 25 th thru July 22 nd
4. Road Excavation and New Stone Base	Late July
5. Concrete Curb and Gutter & Driveways	Late July/Early August
6. Asphalt Paving	Early to Mid August
7. Restoration	Mid to Late August

Garbage Collection will remain on its normal day – Wednesdays. If your garbage does not get picked up for some reason, please call the City Department of Municipal Services and they will assist in getting it collected.

Access to residences will be maintained throughout construction. Vehicular access to drive approaches will be interrupted for approximately 7 to 10 days when the new curb and gutter is poured. Notice will be given in advance of interruption so that people can get their cars out of the driveway.

Junction Street - Street Improvement Project

General Description of the Work:

Contractors for the City of Plymouth will be completing a street improvement project in the northern section of the City on Junction Street (roughly between Pacific and Blunk). The anticipated start date is July 17, 2019 and the work will be completed in two phases. You may see signs and equipment on-site before this date.

Improvement Project Details:

Anticipated Start Date: June 17, 2019
Anticipated Duration: Through early August 2019
Phase 1: South side of Junction (with traffic flow one way to the west)
Phase 2: North side of Junction (with traffic flow one way to the west)
Location: Junction Street from Pacific Street to Blunk Street

Road Improvements:

- Remove and replace intersection of Junction and Pacific.
- Various joint repairs throughout improvement area consistent of concrete removal and replacement.
- These will consist of full depth joint repairs with joint cleaning and new poured rubber.
- This work involves a lot of saw cutting, especially early on in each stage.

Please use caution when walking, jogging, biking or driving in the construction area.

Garbage Collection will remain on its normal day – Mondays. If your garbage does not get picked up for some reason, please call the City Department of Municipal Services and they will assist in getting it collected.

Vehicular access to drive approaches will be interrupted for approximately 7 to 10 days when the concrete cures. Notice will be given in advance of interruption so that people can get their cars out of the driveway. Residents will be asked to park on side streets near your home (tickets will not be issued).
