Central Parking Deck Renovation Update

The City of Plymouth's Central Parking Deck is a key component of the downtown's parking infrastructure. With 274 parking spots on the ground level and upper deck, the parking deck plays a critical role in providing more parking in the downtown without surrendering land for parking which could be used for new developments for retail, dining, or business. Every three to five years, it becomes necessary for the Downtown Development Authority (DDA) to authorize renovation projects to ensure the parking deck remains safe and structurally sound for the public to use.

You might have noticed over the past few months that much of the eastern edge of the parking deck and the pedestrian bridge leading to Main Street were closed to the public for construction. The purpose of this construction was to improve drainage systems throughout the Central Parking Deck, renovate joints and supports connecting both the Central Parking Deck and the pedestrian bridge to improve safety, and to install a new eastern stairwell. Projects like this are necessary to stay ahead of the curve due to wear-down of the structure due to the elements and consistent heavy use by visitors, residents, and local businesses.



The lion's share of the work on the 2022 project has been completed. The only remaining phase is installation of the new eastern stairway, which due to delays in the fabrication process, is now expected in the early winter months of 2023.

As the new year arrives so does more work on the Central Parking Deck. The DDA Board recently gave their approval for engineering (development and planning) to proceed forthe 2023 Central Parking Deck Restoration Project. The bidding process for the project is expected to take place over the winter. Construction is scheduled to begin in May of 2023. The potential scale of the 2023 project is expected to be much larger than the 2022 project and will likely cause intermittent closures of the deck and more significant disruptions to parking.

The 2023 project is scheduled to be completed by Art in the Park weekend. As with all our infrastructure projects, however, the schedule is subject to change due to supply chain issues, unforeseen weather conditions, staffing issues, and other factors. Constitutional Use of Force Training


All Command Officers attended training in the proper use of force.

Snow Removal Reminders

For the safety of all residents, business owners, and visitors to the City of Plymouth, please note the following tips, reminders, and suggestions.

When the City of Plymouth declares a Snow Emergency, no parking is allowed on any public street. Vehicles parked on the street restrict the ability of the plow trucks to efficiently and effectively remove snow from the street surface. Vehicles left on the street during a snow emergency may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense.

Keep fire hydrants clear of snow. A path to access the fire hydrant should be shoveled on the street side from



the curb to the hydrant. Keep snow clear on all sides of the hydrant to ensure quick access in case of emergency.

The Department of Municipal Services responds aggressively to snow events. The DMS crews will plow all snow accumulations of 4" or more. To help limit the amount of snow that ends up in your driveway, follow the diagram shown above. Clearing a section of the street along the curb before your driveway will create a place for the snow to end up. This will reduce the amount that ends up in front of your drive.

You may place your tree at the curb, where Department of Municipal Services crews will chip them as part of the regular brush chipping program.

Please be sure all stands, lights, tinsel, ornaments, and other decorative material is removed prior to placing your tree at the curb.

Winter Taxes

Winter tax bills are in the mail and are payable from December 1, 2022 through February 28, 2023, without penalty. No City of Plymouth taxes are included in the winter bill. Your winter bill includes the tax levies for:

- Wayne County Voted Millage
- Wayne County Jail
- Wayne County Parks
- Plymouth District Library
- Huron Clinton Metro Authority
- Detroit Regional Zoo
- Detroit Institute of Arts Museum

You may mail your payment or pay in person at City Hall Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m. After hours, you may use in the drop box located in the Church Street entrance of City Hall or in the drive-through payment drop box at the Plymouth District Library. Both of these drop boxes are available 24/7. You may also pay by credit card, with an additional fee. Information on credit card payments is on our website at plymouthmi.gov.

Proper Prescription Pill Disposal

In November 2014, the City of Plymouth Police Department partnered with CVS Health to participate in the Safer Communities Program. This program provided grant funding that resulted in the placement of a drug collection receptacle within our City Hall lobby. This receptacle makes it possible for both residents and non-residents to safely dispose of unused and expired prescription pill medication.

In prior decades, it was not unusual for people to dispose of their medication by simply flushing it down the toilet. This resulted in thousands of tons of hazardous pharmaceuticals being introduced into the environment and made conditions ripe for contamination of our lakes, rivers, and streams. With great participation from our community to date, the Police Department has collected and properly disposed of 1,909.5 pounds of prescription pills. In addition to protecting our environment, this has protected our children and others by eliminating the possibility of unused medication falling into the wrong hands.

Thank you to everyone for your participation in this program. Please continue to keep our community safe by properly disposing of all unused medication and pharmaceuticals. Remember, this program is open to everyone. Residency in the City of Plymouth is not required.


Bulk Leaf Pickup

Area A and area D each have one more bulk leaf pickup scheduled.

Residents are required to have leaves neatly raked to the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the Monday of their designated weeks. Having the leaves at the curb on time and on schedule will ensure that when we are collecting leaves on your street, your leaves will not be missed. If we are on your street on Monday and your leaves are not at the curb, it may be several weeks until we are back in your area.

REMINDERS:

- Park cars away from leaf piles as car exhaust may catch leaves on fire.
- Leaf piles that are over storm drains will cause flooding.
 Please take care to keep grates free of



leaves, even if you have to go out in the rain to clear the grates on your street.

- Grass clippings, branches, corn stalks, pumpkins, dirt, rocks, firewood, stumps, root balls, etc. cannot be picked up with bulk leaves. Please do not place these items on top of leaf piles.
- Bulk leaf pickup occurs only in the fall and is separate from curbside compost pickup and brush chipping.
- Please place grass clippings, brush, corn stalks, pumpkins, etc. in brown paper lawn refuse bags or in containers labeled "compost." Weekly compost pick up will occur on your regular trash day through the week of December 5, 2022 by the City's Solid Waste contractors.
