City Commission Members Sworn In



Judge Michael Gerou swears in Suzi Deal as mayor. Deal was elected mayor and O'Donnell was elected mayor pro tem.

Incumbents Suzi Deal, Linda Filipczak, and Kellly O'Donnell, along with newcomer Brock Minton, were sworn in as City Commissioners at a meeting on November 13. They joined Jennifer Kehoe, Alanna Maguire and Nick Moroz, whose terms have not yet expired. Marques Thomey did not seek re-election.

The Plymouth City Charter directs that once the new Commission is sworn in, its members elect the mayor and mayor pro tem.

The Plymouth City Commission was established by charter in July of 1951. All legislation and policies in the city are determined by the City Commission, and its members are responsible for adopting ordinances, resolutions, the budget, and the tax rate. They also oversee the other boards and commissions in the city, including the Cemetery Board, the Downtown Development Authority, the Historic District Commission, the Planning Commission, and the Zoning Board of Appeals. Let it Snow!

It's not everyone's favorite time of year, but City of Plymouth residents and visitors have the benefit of our Department of Municipal Services crew members' committment to excellence. A combination of salt, brine, and snow plows generally keep our roads among the clearest in the area after a winter weather event.

The DMS plows when the snowfall is four inches or more. It's important to remember that the effectiveness of the snow plow is impacted greatly by residents, contractors and business owners' actions. Do not push, blow, plow, throw or otherwise place the snow in the street. Most importantly for the efficiency of our plows, do not push snow back into the street after the plow has been down your street. Pushing snow into the street is against our code of ordinances, and will be strictly enforced. The minimum bill for each offense is \$200.

Property owners must ensure that their sidewalks are clear within 24 hours of the end of snowfall. Promptly remove all snow and ice so you and your neighbors can safely walk throughout the City and to limit your liability in the case of an accident. Please remove snow from edge to edge and from property line to property line including the entire approach to any crosswalks.


Failure to maintain your sidewalks in a safe condition will result in the City removing the snow and/or ice and billing you for the removal. The minimum billing for the first offense is \$150.00, the minimum billing for the second offense is \$200.00, and the minimum billing for the third and any subsequent offense is \$250.00.

2024 Dog Licenses Now Available

If your dog gets out and decides to make a run for it, chances are someone will be able to lure it with a tasty treat and try to find its owner. One way to help facilitate a timely reunion is to get a dog license. Owners are required to purchase a license for dogs in the City of Plymouth that are older than four months. The license fee is \$5 if you purchase or renew your license before it expires on December 31, or \$10 after that date.

You may apply with a current rabies certificate in person, by mail or online complete information is available on our website at plymouthmi.gov/doglicense.

Water Meter Replacement

All homes and businesses in the City of Plymouth are required to have their water meters replaced. If you haven't already done so, please make an appointment with the Department of Municipal Services at 734-453-7737. City of Plymouth staff members will perform the replacement, and it takes about 15 minutes.

Traveling Over the Holidays?

If you plan to be away from your home, you may submit a request to the police department for a vacation check. Simply visit the website at https://www.frontlinepss.com/plymouthmi and enter your information. Time permitting, officers will make regular checks to ensure all is secure while you are gone.

If you are having overnight visitors, remember that street parking is not allowed between the hours of 3 a.m. to 6 a.m. You may, however, request a temporary permit for your visitors at the website above. Street parking permits are not valid during a snow emergency.

Christmas Tree Disposal

When you're ready to dispose of your Christmas tree, please place it at the curb. City crews will pass through the neighborhoods and run trees through the chipper.

Please ensure that trees are free of lights and ornaments and that they are not bagged.

Winter tax bills are in the mail and are payable from December 1, 2023 through February 28, 2024, without penalty. No City of Plymouth taxes are included in the winter bill. Your winter bill includes the tax levies for:

- Wayne County Millage

- Plymouth District Library
- Wayne County Jail
- Wayne County Parks
- Detroit Regional Zoo
- Huron Clinton Metro Authority

You may mail your payment or pay in person at City Hall Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m. After hours, you may use in the drop box located in the Church Street entrance of City Hall or in the drive-through payment drop box at the Plymouth District Library. Both of these drop boxes are available 24/7.
