Please Vote on November 7

In addition to selecting four City Commissioners from a pool of seven, City of Plymouth residents are being asked to decide on a 1.75 mill tax for parks and recreation. This millage would provide funds to make improvements at all neighborhood parks, completely renovate Point Park in Old Village, and potentially purchase the old Lumber Mart site for recreation. In addition, City of Plymouth residents would see a steep decrease in program fees.

A recent EPIC/MRA survey of residents indicated nearly unanimous belief that recreational activites, special events, and parks enhance home values and provide an economic benefit to the community. The City Commission set a goal of improving existing and pursuing additional recreational and public green space opportunities and facilities for all ages at its annual strategic planning session,.

If the millage doesn't pass, the focus of the department will be on maintaining existing facilities, limiting new programming, and scaling back the soccer program due to lack of playing fields.

Ballot Language

Shall Section 8.5 of the Charter of the City of Plymouth, Wayne County, Michigan, be amended to permit the levy by the City of a new additional ad valorem property tax in an amount not to exceed one and three-quarters (1.75) mills, for 12 years, from 2024 through 2035, to provide funds to the City to acquire, construct, improve, furnish, operate and maintain parks and recreation facilities? It is estimated that 1.75 mills would raise approximately \$1,275,955 when first levied in 2024.

Voters are also being asked to select four City Commissioners

from seven candidates: Incumbents Suzi Deal, Linda Filipczak, and Kelly O'Donnell and newcomers Catherine Coburn, Brock Minton, Ron Picard, and Josh Rimatzki.

Michigan Voter Information Center

Am I registered to vote? If I'm not, how can I register? How do I vote absentee? What if I sent in my ballot but change my mind? How do I know if my ballot arrived?

The answers to these questions and more are available on the State of Michigan Voter Information Center website at mvic.sos.state.mi.us. On the "Your Voter Information" page, you can view your registration status, read a sample ballot, and track an absentee ballot.

Registering to vote

If you are not registered to vote, you may register in person with proof of residency at the Plymouth City Clerk's office, which is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m to 4:30 p.m., Saturday, November 4, 2023 from 7:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m., and on Election Day, Tuesday, November 7, 2023 from 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.

Requesting an absent voter ballot

Online and mail requests for an absent voter ballot must be received by the city clerk's office no later than 5 p.m. on Friday, November 3. If you're already registered at your current address, you can request an absent voter ballot in person at the clerk's office anytime up to 4 p.m. on Monday, November 6.

If you're registering to vote or updating your address by appearing at your clerk's office on Election Day, you can request an absent voter ballot at the same time you register. If you request your AV ballot the day before the election or on Election Day, you must vote the ballot in the clerk's office.

October Police Training

Western Wayne County Special Operations Team Training

Team members attended the required regular monthly training sessions involving the many skills needed to successfully intervene during a critical incident situation such as a hostage rescue or barricaded gunman. These skills include: proper planning and response, firearms and equipment proficiency, team movement, surveillance, and much more.

Eastern Michigan University's Center for Regional and National Security School of Police Staff & Command Executive Leadership Program

One of our sergeants completed the final week of this 9-week program. This is an intensive program consisting of 350 hours of classroom instruction that requires out of class study, preparation of papers, projects, and examinations. The experience takes the officer beyond traditional operational methods and incorporates strategic thinking and creative and innovative problem solving skills for current and future law enforcement executives paving the way for further advancement to senior leadership positions within the department.

Crisis Negotiation Team Training

A sub-group of WWCSOT, team members attended regular training regarding skills related to the successful conclusion of hostage and barricaded subject situations.

Medical First Responder Continuing Education

Certified officers attended Continuing Education training regarding emergency preparedness, patient assessment, and pediatric assessment.

Intoxilyzer 9000 Training

Officers were trained in the operation of the new state-approved Breathalyzer device utilized in drunk driving arrests/investigations.

Western Wayne Crash Response Team

Team members attended advanced training in fatal/near-fatal traffic crash investigations.

Fusion Liaison Officer Training

One of our detectives attended this 16-hour program to be a liaison between our agency and the MSP Intelligence Operations Center as it relates to terrorism, criminal activity, public safety, and more.

Rifle/Shotgun Training/Qualification

One of multiple firearms training/qualification days.



Leaf Collection

This year's bulk leaf collection has begun. The dates are as follows: The weeks of November 13 and December 11 - Area A The weeks of October 23 and November 20 - Area B The weeks of October 30 and November 7 - Area C The weeks of November 6 and December 4 - Area D

City crews will pick up your bulk leaves from your curbside during your designated week. Access must be provided from the street. To ensure your leaves are removed quickly and safely, please follow these guidelines:

- Park cars away from leaf piles car exhaust systems may catch leaves on fire.
- Keep storm drains free of leaves and clear leaves frequently to prevent street flooding.
- Keep grass clippings, small branches, corn stalks, pumpkins, dirt, rocks, firewood, stumps, and root balls separate from bulk leaf piles.
- Keep brush chipping limbs in a separate pile away from leaves.

1. Keep temporary yard signs out of the strip between the sidewalk and the street. Visit plymouthmi.gov/codes for details on the sign ordinance.

2. Don't park on public streets between the hours of 3-6 a.m. without a permit. Visit plymouthmi.gov/overnight_parking for instructions on how to get a permit.

3. Secure a removal permit for trees larger than 6" in diameter. Information about the tree ordinance is available at plymouthmi.gov/trees.

4. Keep your grass mowed and snow removed in a timely manner. Snow is to be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of a snowfall. Ordinance information is available at plymouthmi.gov/codes.

5. Email dms@plymouthmi.gov for garbage pick-up of oversized items.

2024 Dog Licenses Now Available

If your dog gets out and decides to make a run for it, chances are someone will be able to lure it with a tasty treat and try to find its owner. Drive Safely this Winter





DON'T BLAME THE WEATHER! DRIVE SLOW ON ICE & SNOW

Most winter driving crashes are <u>not</u> caused by the weather, but by drivers' failure to adjust to road conditions. "Drive slow on ice θ snow" is the theme for our winter driving safety program, and our #1 tip for staying safe on wintry roads. Here's why:

- Most winter driving crashes can be attributed to drivers going too fast for the roadway conditions. When this happens, drivers can lose control, leave their lane, or even leave the roadway.
- On snowy and/or icy roads, it can take up to ten times longer to stop your vehicle. Slowing down and allowing more room between your vehicle and the one ahead of you gives you more time to react and brake, thus reducing your crash risk.
- Michigan speed limit laws require drivers to move at a speed that is "reasonable and proper" for the road conditions. This means that even if you are driving at or under the posted speed limit, you could still get a speeding ticket if the road conditions make that speed unreasonable for safe driving.
- By making adjustments in speed and handling when road conditions are bad, you can take charge of your winter driving safety.
- Don't use cruise control on ice and snow. If your car skids, the cruise control will accelerate to maintain a constant speed spinning your wheels even faster and increasing the chance you will lose control of your vehicle.

Holiday Safety

The National Fire Protection Association offers these holiday safety tips:

- Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant
- Replace any string of lights with loose or broken cords or connections
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so cords don't get damaged
- Turn off all light strings and decorations before going to bed
- Keep decorations away from windows and doors
- Test your smoke alarms and review your home fire escape plan
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop
- Keep children and pets away from lit candles
- Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed


