Body Camera Implementation for Plymouth Police Officers

The Plymouth Police Department has gone LIVE with body cameras and a new in-car video system from Bodyworn by Utility. A new video system has been installed in each patrol vehicle and each officer

has been issued a body camera. Training began last week and is continuing.

The body cameras and the in-car video system will all interact with the Dispatch Center to automatically activate under certain conditions allowing the officer to focus on tactics and techniques that will keep them safe.

The cameras are all high definition and provide excellent video footage. This will provide greater transparency to the public and protection against false accusations for the officer. While the police department has had in-car video systems for nearly 19 years, this is the first time the department has deployed body cameras.

What some might call a delay in the department moving to the body camera platform is really simply a matter of timing and opportunity. Specifically, it provided time for our most recent video platform to reach end of life and for the State of Michigan to better address the privacy

issues that surround the release of information regarding video captured on the body cameras in very private places and circumstances.

Law enforcement is constantly evolving and rapidly moving forward in a variety of ways to provide the public with better customer service. Technology is one of those ways, and we are excited to continue our forward momentum with the deployment of this cutting-edge patrol technology.

April Police Training

Western Wayne County Special Operations Team Training

Team members attended the required regular monthly training sessions involving the many skills needed to successfully intervene during a critical incident situation such as a hostage rescue or barricaded gunman. These skills include: proper planning and response, firearms and equipment proficiency, team movement, surveillance, and much more.

Counterfeit Insurance and Cloned Credit Card Investigation

Officers attended training regarding the most up-to-date techniques associated with fraudulent insurance policies and financial transaction devices.

De-escalation Instructor Training. A train-the-trainer course in de-escalation and relevant techniques.

A.L.I.C.E. (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate)

Instructor training for the presentation of life saving techniques to civilians confronted with an active shooter event.


Step One: Visit the City of Plymouth website at https://plymouthmi.gov. On the home page, click "How Do I ... " then "make a payment."

Step two: Click "Online Payments" then "Search for Billing Records." You may also simply enter your address in the top address bar.

Step three: If you haven't already done so, enter your address.



Step five: Click "Proceed to Payment."

Step six: Select your form of payment, then click "Continue."

When you've completed your payment, the system will invite you to join Invoice Cloud, which will allow you to make future payments by text, as well as credit cards, Google Pay and PayPal.

SPRING CLEAN UP

Spring clean up is a single day collection of large items and extra trash. Each household is allowed 8 trash cans or the equivalent, plus two large items such as furniture and appliances. Small refuse must be placed in a container and may not exceed 50 pounds. Appliances containing Freon must have a valid certificate of Freon removal. Refrigerators and freezers must have the doors removed from the hinges.

Items must be placed on the curb by 6:00 a.m.



Curbside Brush Chipping

Any City of Plymouth resident or business may utilize curbside brush chipping. Brush chipping is a yearround service and allows for the disposal of larger limbs and branches at the curb. No city bags or tags are required for brush pickup. Additionally, there is no need to notify Municipal Services of limbs at the curb. Brush chipping is not available to tree contractors.

Collection Schedule

Brush must be placed at the curb before 6:00 a.m. on the Monday of your designated pickup week. This is not an on-demand service, please follow the below schedule:

If your address is in area A, crews will be in your area the first full week of the month.

If your address is in area B, crews will be in your area the second full week of the month.

If your address is in area C, crews will be in your area the third full week of the month.

If your address is in area D, crews will be in your area the fourth full week of the month.

The schedule is subject to change due to city staffing levels, equipment, weather events, etc.

How it Works

City crews will chip your brush at your curbside. To ensure your brush is chipped quickly and safely, please follow these guidelines:

- Place brush neatly at the curb, stacked in all one direction.
- Place the cut ends facing towards oncoming traffic.

• Ensure limbs are at least 3 feet long – smaller sticks and twigs should be placed out for compost collection in a Kraft bag or can marked for compost.


- Keep limbs long no need to cut into shorter pieces.
- Ensure brush pile is not taller than 5 feet tall.
- Clear root balls of all dirt.

• Limbs with thorns and vines or vine-like weeds cannot be chipped – place vines out for compost collection.

- Ensure vehicles are not blocking or parked too close to brush piles.
- Keep brush removed from any legal, marked parking space or fire hydrant.
- Keep brush separate from bulk leaf piles in the fall season.
- Diameter of each limb should not exceed 6 inches.


